Nine easy steps:

Establishing the brief

Initial design presentation – a small deposit secures our partnership

01 Initial Consultation

The design process begins at one of our showrooms, where you'll have the opportunity to touch and feel the quality, craftsmanship and range of finishes and materials available. This is when:

A designer will take a detailed brief, discussing your priorities, expectations and the way you use your space.

The floorplan or room dimensions are shared, and any structural details/building work identified (architect's drawings are welcome).

Your budget and timescales are discussed.

02 Presentation & Engagement

Next your designer will prepare detailed plans, elevations, a comprehensive quotation and visualisations. This is when:

We showcase our capabilities and ensure our vision aligns with your expectations.

Your designer arranges a meeting to present initial designs.

At this stage, a non-refundable 10% deposit will be required to secure our mutual commitment to delivering your complete design package.

03 Design Development

Over the next few weeks, you and your designer will work together to refine every detail, sharing ideas, thoughts and requirements. This is when:

A detailed storage plan is devised to ensure every item is perfectly placed for cooking ease and efficiency.

You'll receive material samples of your chosen finishes and colours to help with other décor decisions in your kitchen and home.

Appliances, taps and sinks will be discussed where applicable. We can explain the latest technology and innovations and make recommendations to suit your needs.

Our designer may come to visit your home to take measurements, see how you live currently and to discuss how you would like to use the space in the future.

You'll be involved hands-on in the selection of materials and finishes, visiting stone yards and showrooms as required to personally select your unique worktop slabs and perfect appliances.

We introduce you to Rehome, our sustainability partners, who can arrange to dismantle your existing kitchen for re-sale, donation or responsible recycling. Rehome is dedicated to protecting the environment while helping you profit from your old kitchen and other furniture.

04 Site Survey

Before the final design meeting, our surveyor will visit your project to take precise measurements. If the site is not ready or we are working from architect's drawings, we will run through these and you will sign off the agreed dimensions. This is when:

We liaise with your architect, builder, and tradespeople to ensure all preparations are in place for a seamless installation.

We check site access and explain the delivery and installation procedure.

05 Final Design Meeting

Post-survey, we make any necessary adjustments to the design, ensuring everything is perfect and all final decisions have been made before production begins. This is when:

We triple-check every detail and ensure you are 100% happy with every aspect of the design.

Any changes beyond this stage may influence the delivery schedule and final budget.

06 Production & Technical

Things may appear to go a little quiet for you at this point, but this is a vital part of the process as it ensures everything goes perfectly and to plan moving forwards. This is when:

Our production and technical team conduct a thorough review of all drawings, methodically checking every element of the design.

You will receive the final FM (for manufacture) pack including our Terms & Conditions and everything you need to know about your project. This should be carefully read and signed off.

Your contractor receives a clear set of service drawings, detailing all electrical, lighting, extraction and plumbing locations and requirements specific for your project.

An interim payment is paid at this stage; this enables us to confirm your agreed delivery week with our factory and to order product and materials for your project.

Manufacturing takes place at our state-of-the-art facilities in Malvern, and you're assigned an installation co-ordinator

Your new furniture is installed, appliances are connected, worktop and splashback templated

07 Manufacturing

Now it's over to our factory in Malvern for the real magic to happen. This is when:

Our skilled craftspeople get to work, adhering to rigorous quality controls and using ethically sourced materials to individually make your bespoke furniture from scratch.

You will be assigned a dedicated installation co-ordinator who will provide a detailed installation programme and liaise with your tradespeople to ensure site preparation is on track.

The final balance payment is made seven days prior to delivery.

08 Installation

Our installation team will arrive on the date agreed. This is when:

Our installation co-ordinator takes over, scheduling people, products and processes to ensure seamless efficiency and the highest quality installation.

Your project will start to take shape with cabinetry, appliances and fixtures all fitted with the utmost precision.

Any second fix electrical and plumbing work will be arranged with your tradespeople and the worktop/splashback fabricators will arrive to template. We can fit temporary worktops in the interim, if required.





Once the worktops are fitted and snagging is sorted, the project is signed off

09 Completion

Once the worktops are installed, any remaining items will be fitted and tested. Your installation co-ordinator and fitter will visit when you are on-site to carry out a rigorous inspection and compile a snagging list to ensure the highest quality of finish. This is when:

Our professional painter will visit to carry out minor finishing touches, if required. For Classic cabinetry a final hand painted finish will be applied to the furniture on site.

We will remove all rubbish from site and professionally clean all cabinetry, appliances and worktops, leaving you with an immaculate home that is ready to enjoy.

You will provide final sign off, confirming you're happy and satisfied with the Roundhouse experience.
